Course on Scientific Writing and Preparation to Congresses

The course consists of two parts: the first regards scientific writing in English while the second focuses on PowerPoint presentations preparation and the oral presentation of your work at conferences and congresses.

Scientific Writing

Overview on scientific writing general rules, lexical, grammatical and structural aspects of articles' different sections. This part of the course gives particular attention to the most common mistakes of Italian writers in English. Besides the rules' review, during each section an English text written by Italian researchers will be analyzed, highlighting correct and incorrect use of such rules.

Preparation to congresses

Initially this part concerns planning and writing PowerPoint presentations according to international rules and methodical aspects of presentation during congresses and conferences. Each participant will have to prepare a presentation of their work and present it to the rest of the class. The written and oral presentation will then be analyzed, taking into account the presentation modality, the used lexicon and grammar, the language confluence, the logical relationships between the different parts of the presentation, etc.

The presentations prepared by the participants have to be sent to the Lecturer before the lesson so that their quality and adequacy can be verified
